This project is intended as an exploration of different approaches to the integration of ICT in the teaching and learning process in the member countries. For this, the school members will start with researching the methods for ICT teaching both as a subject in itself and as a tool in other subjects in the curricula. By collecting all sorts of relevant and outstanding examples of good practice in the ICT-education field, in all different formats (written, audiovisual, digital ) the basis of a bank in digital form of best practices in ICT will be formed.

This, together with the collection of good practices in ICT teaching will form the basis of a website entitled” Bite the Byte: How to teach with New Technologies”. The involvement of students and other teachers not taking part in the project will come through the inclusion of collaborative spaces such as online forums, wikis, blogs and tools for social construction learning such as Moodle . The website will finally be transferred to a cd-rom which constitutes the final product of our project after 2 years’ time. The results of the experience will be dissiminated in the local communities through the website and the resulting cd rom.
